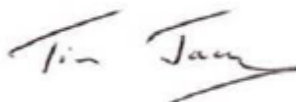

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ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY 2025/26

1. INTRODUCTION

Circle Recycling Limited (Circle), acknowledges the need for sustainable development and consistently strives to protect the environment and prevent pollution.

We recognise that our activities result in both direct and indirect impacts on the environment.

Committed to minimising these impacts, we aim to implement a programme of pollution prevention and continuous improvement in environmental performance, with commitment from top-level management and below.

2. SCOPE

This policy applies to all employees, contractors, agents, suppliers, partners, and any other individuals acting on behalf of Circle.

3. POLICY STATEMENT

Circle strictly prohibits any form of bribery, corruption, or unethical behaviour in all business operations. The company is committed to maintaining transparent and fair relationships with all stakeholders, including customers, suppliers, government officials, and other third parties.

4. WASTE MANAGEMENT & DISPOSAL

We will employ the following waste control hierarchy for environmental sustainability:

- Reducing waste going to landfill through efficient recycling and recovery techniques.
- Minimising final disposal, ensuring only minimal items fit for landfill will go there.
- Continually reviewing operations and monitoring waste levels to seek opportunities for environmental performance improvement.
- Auditing disposal points and recycling facilities to ensure environmental transparency and efficiency.

It is our policy to ensure that all waste produced is disposed of in accordance with the requirements of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and the subsequent Regulations made under this act.

Resulting waste will be disposed of using licensed waste carriers with copies of the requisite waste transfer notes held on file.

5. FLEET & LOGISTICS

We aim to reduce greenhouse gas and tailpipe emissions by improving fuel economy, reducing miles driven, and reducing the need for major repairs. This will be achieved by:

- Servicing vehicles regularly to maintain optimum performance.
- Encouraging eco-friendly driving habits among employees.
- Collecting and analysing fuel consumption data.
- Phasing out all Euro V engines and replacing them with Euro VI engines or electric.
- Implementing a replacement plan for old, high-emission vehicles.
- Continually aiming to reduce CO2 emissions through training and review.

Circle sub-contracts a fleet of articulated vehicles (walking floors) and 8 wheeled tippers to collect and transport waste types from our recycling facilities into our network of recovery, recycling and disposal partners. We understand the imperative need for utilising some of the

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most energy-efficient vehicles in the market and will only allow Euro 6 vehicles access to our facilities.

Circle is also dedicated to reducing engine idling and fuel spillages. We acknowledge that engine idling not only wastes fuel and money but also prematurely wears engines and causes unnecessary environmental impact. It's the responsibility of every driver and machine operator at Circle to minimise fleet operating costs while reducing harmful environmental effects. We manage fuel spillages with specific procedures to decrease their frequency and environmental impact. All Circle staff are trained to handle minor spills and are well-versed in the protocol for major spillages.

We monitor our fleet continuously, and as part of our ongoing vehicle replacement plan, we have purchased 12 new vehicles since 2015. These vehicles are all equipped with the latest European Emissions Standard VI (Euro VI) engines, which significantly reduce tailpipe and other emissions.

In addition to our 'on the road' vehicles, Circle operates a fleet of mobile plant that are also included in our replacement plan. Since the beginning of 2020, we have replaced 2 out of 4 mobile machines with the latest specification, and we continually improve the efficiency of our vehicle fleet and infrastructure to minimise environmental impacts and boost efficiency.

6. CARBON EMISSIONS

Circle is committed to reducing the environmental impact of our operations and ensuring that all possible measures are taken to mitigate climate change and its adverse impact. We are dedicated to complying with applicable legislation in all the jurisdictions where we operate and will share our achievements with all stakeholders within and outside the organisation. This is achieved by:

- Monthly carbon data monitoring of Circle operations, including on-site mobile plant emissions, vehicle fleet emissions, electricity consumption, gas consumption, water consumption, and waste production.
- Reviewing carbon data in relation to business growth and formulating future strategies to reduce emissions.
- Being transparent about the impact of Circle activities on the environment by sharing carbon data with customers and the public via our website and newsletters.

7. ENERGY CONSUMPTION

We will minimise the impact of our current operations by managing our energy consumption effectively through the efficient use of electricity, gas, water, and other resources. We aim to install LED lighting and solar PV, use reusable materials wherever possible, and manage our waste responsibly by recycling as many waste streams as possible to reduce landfill waste.

8. SENSIBLE AND SUSTAINABLE PROCUREMENT

We always endeavour to purchase products and services locally that cause the least damage to the environment, from suppliers who share our environmental goals and KPIs. We assess suppliers to ensure we only work with compliant companies that have a strong environmental ethos and awareness. We actively source carbon and environmentally conscious suppliers to reduce the environmental impact through third-party actions, which includes sourcing locally whenever possible.

9. ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

We will continue to remain compliant with our Environmental Management System and work towards obtaining our ISO14001 accreditation by 2023 and promote continual improvement across the business in relation to environmental aspects and impacts. We aim to keep the number of non-conformances reported internally and externally through audits and inspections as low as possible, and any identified opportunity for improvement will be reviewed and implemented.

10. EMPLOYEE ENGAGEMENT

We will involve employees in environmental objectives and strategies, supported from top-level management down. This will be achieved through training and raising awareness of environmental drivers and impacts from business activities.

11. RISK MANAGEMENT

We will determine the environmental risks associated with our environmental aspects and impacts and implement risk control and incident response plans to ensure that environmental impacts are minimised during any emergency.

12. REVIEW

This Policy and supporting documents will be continually monitored and updated, particularly when changes in the scale and nature of our operations occur. The policy will be updated at least every twelve months and made available to employees, contractors, and visitors on the Circle company website, employee handbooks, notice boards and via email.

We at Circle acknowledge and fulfil our responsibility to safeguard the health and safety of all visitors to our company, including contractors, temporary workers, and members of the public who might be affected by our operations.

NET ZERO & CARBON REDUCTION POLICY & PLAN 2025/26

1. INTRODUCTION

Circle Recycling Limited operates within the construction and demolition waste sector, an industry traditionally associated with high carbon intensity, resource depletion, and landfill dependency. From its inception, Circle Recycling has recognised that tackling climate change and progressing toward Net Zero requires more than regulatory compliance; it demands sustained investment, data-driven decision-making, and a fundamental shift toward circular resource management.



This document sets out Circle Recycling's integrated approach to carbon reduction, Net Zero delivery, and circular economy leadership. It builds upon existing policy commitments and demonstrates how operational action, infrastructure investment, and transparent reporting combine to deliver measurable environmental outcomes for both Circle Recycling and its customers.

2. SCOPE

This policy applies to all employees, contractors, agents, suppliers, partners, and any other individuals acting on behalf of Circle.

3. DYNAMIC CARBON REDUCTION POLICY

Circle Recycling operates a dynamic carbon reduction policy that is reviewed and updated regularly to reflect changes in technology, regulation, customer requirements, and operational learning. Rather than setting static targets, the business focuses on continuous improvement, prioritising interventions that deliver real-world carbon reductions across Scope 1, 2, and 3 emissions.

Carbon reduction considerations are embedded within capital investment decisions, procurement, fleet strategy, and service design. This ensures environmental performance is treated as a core business metric alongside safety, compliance, and commercial resilience.

4. INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENERGY DECARBONISATION

Significant progress has been made in reducing emissions from fixed infrastructure. Across Circle Recycling's office locations in Liverpool and Bolton, all gas boilers have been removed and replaced with electric radiators and electric water boilers, eliminating on-site fossil fuel combustion. Building fabric improvements include the replacement of all legacy single-pane windows, installation of new roof insulation, and the use of PIR-controlled lighting to minimise unnecessary energy consumption. External floodlighting has been upgraded to energy-efficient LED units.

Electricity supply has been migrated to tariffs delivering a minimum of seventy percent renewable energy. In parallel, Circle Recycling's new construction and demolition processing plant has been designed to operate entirely on mains electricity, removing reliance on diesel-powered fixed plant and significantly reducing direct emissions and local air quality impacts.

5. DIGITAL AND OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY

Circle Recycling has reduced energy demand associated with IT and data infrastructure by replacing older desktop equipment with energy-efficient laptops and modern base units. On-site servers have been removed entirely and replaced with cloud-based systems, reducing electricity consumption, cooling requirements, and associated carbon emissions while improving data resilience and scalability.

6. FLEET, TRANSPORT AND AIR QUALITY

Transport is one of the most challenging sources of carbon emissions in the waste sector. Circle Recycling has removed all Euro 5 vehicles from its fleet and replaced them with Euro 6 compliant vehicles, delivering immediate emissions and air quality improvements. The business was first to market operating Manchester's first electric skip vehicle, enabling zero-emission skip services for city centre customers.



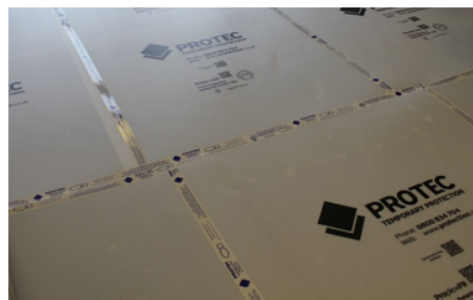
Field-based staff are increasingly supported with hybrid vehicles, supported by the installation of two electric vehicle charging points. Safer driving initiatives and enhanced fuel management practices further reduce fuel consumption and embed carbon awareness at driver level.

7. DATA, REPORTING AND CUSTOMER CARBON TRANSPARENCY

Data and reporting are central to Circle Recycling's Net Zero strategy. The business now provides customers with detailed waste data, recovery rates, and carbon-related performance metrics, enabling clients to understand and reduce their Scope 3 emissions. Reporting is evidence-led, using weights, material streams, and recovery outcomes to produce transparent, auditable information that supports customer sustainability reporting and Net Zero pathways.

7. CIRCULAR ECONOMY AND RE-USE LEADERSHIP

Circle Recycling actively prioritises re-use and UK remanufacturing ahead of recycling and disposal. A key example is the Protec flooring project, where reusable flooring materials are recovered from construction projects for re-use wherever possible, with remaining scrap returned to the UK manufacturer for reprocessing into new Protec flooring products.



The business partners with specialist UK reprocessors to maximise circular outcomes, including recycling uPVC window frames through sister company PVCR in Widnes in partnership with Rehau, supplying rigid plastics to Axion Polymers for use in the UK automotive sector, returning plasterboard to UK reprocessors, and prioritising wash plant technology to produce WRAP Protocol compliant soils and aggregates from excavated material.

8. CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT AND LEADERSHIP

Collectively, these initiatives represent a substantial commitment for a growing SME. By combining infrastructure decarbonisation, fleet transformation, data-led reporting, and circular economy partnerships within a dynamic carbon reduction framework, Circle Recycling

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demonstrates credible leadership in tackling Net Zero while delivering practical, scalable environmental benefit across the waste management sector.

9. TEN-YEAR VISION: A FOSSIL-FREE FUTURE

Circle Recycling's long-term ambition is clear and unequivocal: to become a fully fossil fuel-free waste management business within the next ten years. This ambition is shared and actively supported by the company's directors and shareholders, who fundamentally believe that a complete transition away from fossil fuels is both achievable and necessary for the future resilience of the business and the sector as a whole.



Over the next decade, Circle Recycling will progressively transition its vehicle fleet and mobile plant away from diesel dependency. This includes the phased replacement of diesel-powered HGVs, skip vehicles, and site-based mobile plant with electric, hydrogen, or other verified zero-emission alternatives as technology, infrastructure, and duty cycles allow. Investment decisions will continue to prioritise solutions that deliver genuine carbon reduction rather than short-term compliance.

Fixed infrastructure will continue to be designed on the assumption of zero fossil fuel use. Future sites, plant upgrades, and processing technologies will be specified to operate entirely on low-carbon electricity. As part of this commitment, Circle Recycling has set a clear target to move to a 100% renewable electricity tariff by 2027, ensuring that all fixed-site operations are powered entirely by renewable sources, supported by increasing levels of on-site generation and energy storage as these become viable. Circle Recycling will also continue to explore on-site generation opportunities where appropriate, further reducing reliance on grid-based energy.

Data and digital capability will play an increasingly important role in achieving this vision. Circle Recycling will enhance its carbon accounting, reporting, and forecasting capabilities to track progress toward fossil-free operations, inform investment decisions, and provide customers with increasingly robust carbon intelligence. This will support both internal accountability and external transparency.

Crucially, Circle Recycling recognises that achieving a fossil-free future cannot be delivered in isolation. The business will continue to work collaboratively with customers, supply chain partners, technology providers, and regulators to accelerate innovation, overcome infrastructure barriers, and support wider sector transition.
